## The Lord's Supper



The Communion Table is open to all who are hungry for grace and is available for anyone longing for God's love. The bread and cup are symbolic acts of worship to partake in the New Covenant established by the death and resurrection of Jesus and is a way to experience the real presence of Christ. Allow this time of exhortation and prayer to commune with God in your soul for renewal, repentance and rejoicing.

Communion, The Lord's Supper, and The Eucharist are different traditional church designations to say the same event regarding Jesus' inauguration of the first time He broke bread and drake wine with His disciples in the upper room. The universal Church ceremonially commemorates this meal regularly, in which bread and cup are consecrated and consumed. Bayside celebrates Communion on the first Sunday of each month with a meal called The Love Feast.

The word eucharist comes from the Greek word that means "thanksgiving" and is the posture Christians are to have in participating in this holy ritual. In the spirit of thanksgiving, and as an act of worship, a church member presides over the table and shares with the church a story on how thankful he or she is from God's recent redemptive activity in his or her life.

The Pastor will complete this time of worship by leading the church in reading Mark 14:22-24, then a thanksgiving prayer, and closing out with eating and drinking of the elements.
